### Bible Study:



Read Genesis 24. Consider how God has demonstrated to be a God of “steadfast love and faithfulness” (verses 27 and 49) in your life.

### The gospel in the story:



The story of Isaac’s marriage is another example of God’s sovereignty and faithfulness. His promise to make a nation of Abraham that would be blessed **to be a blessing to the entire world**, was going to move forward through Isaac and Rebekah’s family. God orchestrated the circumstances to bring Isaac and Rebekah together in the land of Canaan that would become the land of Israel, and eventually give rise to the Savior, Jesus. One person in particular who was blessed (besides Isaac and Rebekah) was Abraham’s servant, who worshiped God for leading him on a Holy Journey; the servant saw how his mission was set apart for God’s glory!

### Application

#### Head: What did we learn?

Q: Who is Isaac? A: Abraham’s only son by Sarah

Q: Where is Isaac living when Abraham decides to find him a wife? A: Canaan.

Q: Who does Abraham want for Isaac’s wife? A: A woman from Abraham’s family, not from the Canaanites.

Q: What is Abraham’s plan for finding a wife for Isaac? A: To send a servant to the land of his family to find a woman that would travel back to Canaan.

Q: Why did Abraham insist that Isaac not leave Canaan. A: Because Canaan is the land God promised to Abraham

Q: How did the servant find the right person? A: He waited at a well, and **prayed** that the one who offered to water his camels would be the one chosen by God to be Isaac’s wife?

Q: What was the woman God chose to be Isaac’s wife? A: Rebekah

#### Heart : Memory verse

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#### Hands: How does this affect the way I live?

God has proven his steadfast love and faithfulness again and again. Therefore we can be assured that he is completely trustworthy.

#### Home: How does this affect my household?

Just as God was faithful in building Abraham’s household, and we can trust him to provide for ours.

#### Heaven: How does this help me share my faith?

Abraham’s trust was a witness to God’s faithfulness, and it impacted others, like the servant and Rebekah’s family. We can similarly trust God and be witnesses to His faithfulness to our family, neighbors and friends; TELL people about the good works Jesus has done in your heart!
