The gospel in the story:

Learning At Home

Bible Study:

Read Genesis 41, and Psalm 105. Consider all the ways Joseph suffered, but God guided and protected Joseph and his family.

At the heart of the gospel is the truth that God is everything, and we are nothing without Him. In Genesis 41:16, Joseph was clear in his proclamation that he could not interpret Pharaoh's dream, but that God could. As a result, Pharaoh saw God's power and provision and recognized that there was no other person in Egypt who would match what God would do through this Hebrew, Joseph.

Application

Head: What did we learn?

Q: How did Joseph get out of jail? A: He was brought to Pharaoh and asked to interpret dreams.Q: How did Pharaoh hear of Joseph? A: Joseph had correctly interpreted the cupbearer's dream while in jail.

Q: Could Joseph interpret dreams? A: No, only God could.

Q: What did Pharaoh's dreams mean? A: That there was going to be a seven-year period of plenty, followed by a seven-year period of famine.

Q: What was Pharaoh's reaction? A: He put Joseph in charge because he recognized that God had given Joseph great discernment.

Heart ; Memory verse

Hands; How does this affect the way I live?

Home: How does this affect my household?
