Bible Study:

Read Exodus 2:11-25; 3. Consider how God once again selects an unlikely candidate – a man wanted for murderer – to carry out His purposes. God also introduces ‘makes Himself known’ to Moses in a way that He did not to the Patriarchs (see Exodus 6:2-3). We are introduced to a Mighty and PERSONAL God, who’s Name means – I AM –

The gospel in the story:

Moses’ life started out as a big rescue story – being lifted up out of the water by Pharaoh’s daughter and raised as a prince. Despite his miraculous beginnings, Moses does not prove himself to be a very good rescuer. He sinned greatly when he took the mistreatment of the Israelite slaves into his own hands. In a beautiful act of Grace and forgiveness, God chooses Moses anyway to be the lead ambassador to carry out God’s Perfect plan of rescue. God uses broken people to accomplish great things by His Power and Will.

*Application**Head:* **What did we learn?**

Q: Who is Moses? A: An Israelite who grew up in Pharaoh’s household.

Q: Why did Moses have to flee Egypt? A: Because he killed an Egyptian who was beating an Israelite

Q: Where did Moses go when he left Egypt? A: To Midian.

Q: What happened to Moses while he was in Midian? A: He got married and had a son.

Q: What happened when Moses saw a burning bush that was on fire but didn’t burn up? A: God spoke to him and told Moses that he would rescue the Israelites.

Heart : **Memory verse**

‘I have promised to bring you up out of your misery.’ Exodus 3:17

Hands: **How does this affect the way I live my life?**

Scripture tells us that God is trustworthy. Just as he did not forget the Israelites, or his promise to them, God will not forget any that belong to Him.

Home: **How does this affect my household?**

Though Moses grew up in an Egyptian house, and lived in Midian for a long time, his primary identity was child of Abraham, part of God’s chosen people. Just as Moses’ household represented a larger family, so should our households, represent Jesus.

Heaven: **How does this help me share my faith?**

God wanted to display His power in coming to the rescue of the Israelites. Moses’ part was to trust God, to be obedient, and to proclaim God’s truth to his own people, and their captors.
