Saul Chosen King

MEMORY VERSE: "but they have rejected me as their king." 1 Samuel 8:7

SCRIPTURES: 1 Samuel 8 – 10

AIM: Because of sin, our fleshly heart wants to reject God

A king is someone who watches over his people. He gives the people a sense of identity and unity. He leads them into battle. He sees that justice is administered. Israel had the best King ever – God the Creator – yet because of sin in their hearts, they rejected God's Kingship, and sought after a human king instead. It happened this way...

One day, after Samuel had been judge of Israel for many years, the elders of Israel came to Samuel. "You are getting old now, Samuel, and there is no one else like you to look after the people." (you see, Samuel's sons had become bad judges). "We want a king, just like all the other nations."

Samuel was very upset, so he talked to God about the Israelites wanting a king. God said, "Don't feel bad, Samuel. It isn't you they are rejecting. It is me who they have turned away from." Then God told Samuel to let them have a king, but to warn them that it wouldn't end up well for the people. So Samuel gave the people God's message that instead of having a king that would make them safe and secure (as God had done), their earthly king would actually end up taking more from them, than he would give.

But the Israelites still said, "We want a king!" So God allowed that to happen. He instructed Samuel to choose for king a man from Benjamin, who God told Samuel would come visit Samuel the next day.

That next day, a man named Saul, was out looking for his father's donkeys. He and his servant walked many miles searching for them. When Saul was ready to give up, his servant said, "I just thought of something. There is a prophet who lives in a city near here. Let's go ask him if he can tell us where the donkeys are."
