Shepherd David, King of Worship

MEMORY VERSE: "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want." Psalms 23:1

SCRIPTURES: I Samuel 17:34-37

AIM: We were all created to worship God

David was the youngest of seven sons belonging to Jesse. Since he was the youngest he was the shepherd boy. Three of his brothers were in Saul's army fighting the Philistines.

All David took when he went to take care of the sheep was his lunch in a leather bag, his rod to help him defend the flock, his staff and his sling.
