David Serves Saul

Scriptures: 1 Samuel 16:14-23; 17

Memory Verse: I will sing to the LORD all my life. Psalm 104:33

Aim: David followed God by serving Saul

King Saul disobeyed God, and God chose to find another king. Now the Spirit of the LORD had left Saul, and the LORD sent a tormenting spirit that filled Saul with depression and fear.

Some of Saul's servants said to him, "A tormenting spirit from God is troubling you. Let us find a good musician to play the harp whenever the tormenting spirit troubles you. He will play soothing music, and you will soon be well again."

"All right," Saul said. "Find me someone who plays well, and bring him here."

One of the servants said to Saul, "One of Jesse's sons from Bethlehem is a talented harp player. Not only that—he is a brave warrior, and has good judgment. He is also a fine-looking young man, and the LORD is with him."

So Saul sent messengers to Jesse to say, "Send me your son David, the shepherd." Jesse responded by sending David to Saul, along with a young goat, a donkey loaded with bread, and a wineskin full of wine.
